

Proof of your COVID-19 vaccination

How your COVID-19 vaccination is recorded

Proof of your COVID-19 vaccination will be recorded on your **immunisation history statement** after you've had your vaccine. Once you have received all required doses, you will also be able to access your **COVID-19 digital certificate**.

Adding proof of your COVID-19 vaccination to the Service NSW app

It's easy to add your COVID-19 digital certificate to the Service NSW app. This means you can quickly check in and show proof of your COVID-19 vaccination wherever it's required.

You will need a MyServiceNSW Account to add your proof of COVID-19 vaccination to the Service NSW app. Creating an account is easy and connects you online with NSW Government services, quickly and securely.

When you add your COVID-19 digital certificate to the Service NSW app, the certificate is only stored on your phone or mobile device. There are controls to ensure your privacy is protected.

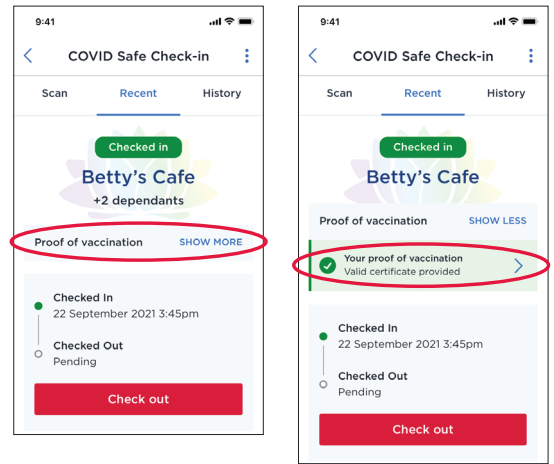
- 1 Make sure you have the latest version of the Service NSW app on your device. You can download or update it via the App store or Play store.
- 2 Share your COVID-19 digital certificate with the Service NSW app using one of the following methods:

Log in to the Service NSW app on your device and follow the prompts to add your COVID-19 digital certificate to your profile.

Select **Show more** to show you have a valid certificate when you check in.



Save your COVID-19 digital certificate

If you prefer to save your certificate to your phone, you can add your COVID-19 digital certificate to your Apple Wallet or Google Pay.

Printing a paper COVID-19 digital certificate

You can print your COVID-19 digital certificate or immunisation history statement at home, to carry with you as proof of your vaccination status. A black and white copy will be accepted. You can print a copy by downloading a PDF using your Medicare online account through myGov or the Express Plus Medicare app.

If you can't access proof of your COVID-19 vaccinations online, you can:

- Ask your vaccination provider to print your immunisation history statement or COVID-19 digital certificate for you
- Call the Australian Immunisation Register on 1800 653 809 between 8am and 5pm, Monday to Friday. Ask them to send your immunisation history statement to you. It can take up to 14 days to arrive by mail.

Proof of medical exemption

If you're unable to be vaccinated because of a medical contraindication (which means a person should not receive a certain medicine because it may be harmful to them), from 17 October you can add the COVID-19 digital certificate for your medical contraindication to the Service NSW app in the same way as proof of vaccination. You can also get a vaccine medical contraindication form signed by your doctor and carry it with you.
