## Research: OCEAN General Practice Nurse (GPN) Beta test and evaluation



The University of Sydney and University of Wollongong are seeking 30 general practice nurses (GPN) to participate in the validation of a new data collection method involving a cloud-based electronic interface called OCEAN (Occasions of Care Explained And Analysed).

What is the study about? Currently, there is no comprehensive data collection instrument that gathers information about the problems that present to, or are managed by, Australian nurses in the primary care/community setting. Therefore, there is no reliable information on the practice activity of these nurses. To inform workforce planning, educational offerings, models of care and clinical policy, baseline and ongoing data about nursing work is essential. The OCEAN tool has been created to address this gap and provide unique data about the contribution of nurses in the primary care/community setting.

What would you have to do? We are asking for volunteers who are currently employed as a nurse in a general practice to test the functionality and usability of the OCEAN tool. You will be asked to participate in a Zoom teleconference with a project officer who is an experienced nurse. During this session you will be asked to complete an electronic form (the OCEAN tool) for up to 3 hypothetical patient visits, recording data about the patient, their problems and the treatment provided. The information will be drawn from the scenario provided. We will then ask for your feedback about the functionality and usability of the OCEAN tool verbally and in a short survey. We will record the session (recording the data entry screen only) so that you can ask questions, and offer comments, during the recording process. The session will take approximately 60-90 minutes to complete.
